Notice for the LCD Display

In order to maintain the stable luminous performance, it is recommended to use low brightness setting.

Due to the lifespan of the lamp, it is normal that the brightness quality of the LCD display may decrease with time.

When static images are displayed for long periods of time, the image may cause an imprint on the LCD display. This is called image retention or burn-in.

To prevent image retention, do any of the following:

- Set the LCD display to turn off after a few minutes of being idle.
- Use a screen saver that has moving graphics or a blank white image.
- · Switch desktop backgrounds regularly.
- Adjust the LCD display to low brightness settings.
- Turn off the LCD display when the system is not in use.

Things to do when the LCD display shows image retention:


- Turn off the LCD display for extended periods of time. It can be several hours or several days.
- Use a screen saver and run it for extended periods of time.
- Use a black and white image and run it for extended periods of time.

There are millions of micro transistors inside the LCD display. It is normal for a few transistors to be damaged and to produce spots. This is acceptable and is not considered a failure.

1.1 Package Contents

When unpacking, check if the following items are included in the package. If any of them is missing or damaged, contact your dealer.





1.2 Installation


1.2.1 Installing the Stand (for SC-32E/SC-42E)

- 1. Place the LCD display with the screen side down on a cushioned surface.
- 2. Attach the base to the stand and fix with the screws to join them tightly.
- 3. Attach the base stand to the LCD display and fix with the screws to join them tightly.



1.2.2 Adjusting the Tilt (for SC-32E/SC-42E)

For comfort viewing, tilt the LCD display up to an angle of -7° to 17°. Hold the stand with one hand and use the other to adjust the LCD display to the desired angle.



1.2.3 Wall Mounting


To wall mount the LCD display, do the following steps:

1. Remove the base stand.

Refer to page 54.


2. Wall mount the LCD display.

Screw the mounting bracket to the VESA holes at the rear of the LCD display.




Note: Take measures to prevent the LCD display from falling down and lessen possible injury and damage to the display in case of earthquakes or other disasters.

- Use only the 100 x 100 mm wall mount kit recommended by AG Neovo. All AG Neovo wall mount kits comply with VESA standard.
- Secure the LCD display on a solid wall strong enough to bear its weight.
- It is suggested to wall mount the LCD display without tilting it facing downward.

Remote control sensor:


Receives command signals from the remote control.

- Lights green when the display is turned on.
- Lights amber when the display is in standby mode.
- · Lights off when the main power of the display is turned off.

MENU:

OSD menu ON/OFF.



UP (**▲**): Hot Key: Source Key

When OSD menu is ON, navigate through adjustment icons or adjust a function.



DOWN (▼): Hot Key: Volume Key

- When OSD menu is ON, navigate through adjustment icons or adjust a function.
- When the ▼ button is pressed, the volume can be adjusted. The ▲/▼ buttons can be used for the volume adjustment.



AUTO: Hot Key: Freeze On/Off

When OSD menu is ON, the key is used for function adjust confirm.



POWER:


Press to turn the display on or off.



Kensington security slot:


Used for security and theft prevention.

1.4 Remote Control




1.4.1 Inserting the Batteries in the Remote Control

The remote control is powered by two 1.5V AAA batteries.

To install or replace batteries:

- 1. Press and then slide the cover to open it.
- 2. Align the batteries according to the (+) and (-) indications inside the battery compartment.
- 3. Replace the cover.





CAUTION:

The incorrect use of batteries can result in leaks or bursting. Be sure to follow these instructions:

- Place "AAA" batteries matching the (+) and (–) signs on each battery to the (+) and (–) signs of the battery compartment.
- Do not mix battery types.
- Do not combine new batteries with used ones. It causes shorter life or leakage of batteries.
- Remove the dead batteries immediately to prevent them from liquid leaking in the battery compartment. Don't touch exposed battery acid, as it can damage your skin.

Note:

- If you do not intend to use the remote control for a long period, remove the batteries.
- The remote control may not function properly when the remote control sensor on this display is under direct sunlight or strong illumination, or when there is an obstacle in the path of signal transmission.

1.4.2 Handling the Remote Control


- Do not subject to strong shock.
- Do not allow water or other liquid to splash the remote control. If the remote control gets wet, wipe it dry immediately.
- Avoid exposure to heat and steam.
- Other than to install the batteries, do not open the remote control.

1.4.3 Operating Range of the Remote Control

Point the top of the remote control toward the display's remote control sensor (front side) when pressing a button.

Use the remote control within the range which is shown in the following table.

Operation Angle	RC operational distance
θ= 0° (for H & V)	≥ 8m
θ= 20° (for H & V)	≥ 5m
θ= 45° (for H only)	≥ 2m



CHAPTER 2: MAKING CONNECTIONS




CAUTION:

Make sure that the LCD display is not connected to the power outlet before making any connections. Connecting cables while the power is ON may cause possible electric shock or personal injury.

2.1 Connecting the AC Power

- 1. Connect the power cord to the AC power input at the rear of the LCD display.
- 2. Connect the power cord plug to a power outlet or a power supply.






CAUTION:

When unplugging the power cord, hold the power cord by the plug head. Never pull by the cord.

2.2 Connecting Input Source Signals

Input source signals can be connected with either of the following cables:



• HDMI

Connect one end of an HDMI cable to the HDMI connector of the LCD display and the other end to the HDMI connector of the computer.

• DVI

Connect one end of a DVI cable to the DVI connector of the LCD display and the other end to the DVI connector of the computer.

• VGA

Connect one end of a D-Sub (VGA) cable to the D-Sub (VGA) connector of the LCD display and the other end to the D-Sub (VGA) connector of the computer.



2.3 Connecting Audio Devices


Audio Input

Connect one end of an audio cable to the AUDIO IN port of the LCD display and the other end to the AUDIO OUT port of the computer.



Audio Output

Connect a headphone to the headphone jack (igcap) of the LCD display.




2.4 Connecting a Video Device

· CVBS IN

Connect one end of a composite cable to the CVBS port of the LCD display and the other end to the CVBS port of the video device.


CVBS OUT

Connect one end of a composite cable to the CVBS port of the LCD display and the other end to the CVBS port of the external display.



2.5 Connecting a USB Storage Device


Connect a USB storage device to the USB port of the LCD display for firmware upgrade or multimedia function.



CHAPTER 3: USING THE LCD DISPLAY

3.1 Turning on the Power

- 1. Plug the power cord to a power outlet or power supply.
- 2. Press the (1) button on the control panel or on the remote control to turn the LCD display on.




When the LCD display is turned on, press the \bigcirc button to turn off the LCD display.

Note: The LCD display still consumes power as long as the power cord is connected to the power outlet. Disconnect the power cord to completely cut off power.

3.2 Using FREEZE Function

The FREEZE function allows you to freeze the screen image but still continues real-time playback until the image is unfreeze.

Press the AUTO button on the LCD display control panel to activate screen freeze, the screen freeze message is displayed on the screen.



Note: The FREEZE function is available only during video input signals but not available when the input source is USB.

Press the AUTO button again to deactivate screen freeze. The screen freeze off message is displayed on the screen.




The screen image displays the elapsed real-time playback image when screen freeze is deactivated.



3.3 Adjusting the Volume

Press the ▼ button on the control panel or either of the VOL +/- buttons on the remote control to call out the volume adjustment menu.



Press the \blacktriangle/∇ button on the control panel or either of the VOL+/- buttons on the remote control to adjust volume.

Note: During volume or menu setting adjustment, press and hold the ▲ or ▼ button on the control panel or either of the VOL +/- buttons on the remote control to change the values continuously.

3.3.1 Muting Audio


Press the MUTE 💢 button on the remote control to mute audio. The mute icon is displayed on the screen.



Press the MUTE K button on the remote control again to unmute audio.

3.4 Selecting a Source

Press the \blacktriangle button on the control panel or the SOURCE button on the remote control to call out the source selection menu.



Press the ▲/▼ button on the LCD control panel or on the remote control to select the input source. Then press the OK button on the remote control to confirm or wait until the source menu disappears from the screen automatically. The available input options include "VGA", "HDMI", "DVI", "CVBS", and "USB".


Note: Every time you switch to the VGA source, the LCD display performs screen adjustment automatically.

3.5 Locking the Control Buttons

Note: Locking the control buttons is not available when the input source is USB.

There are two options to lock the control buttons: lock all the buttons or lock all but Power button.


• KEY LOCK (ALL): Press MENU button for 5 seconds to enable/disable the KEY LOCK (ALL) function.



The key lock message is displayed on the screen.



 KEY LOCK (w/o POWER): Press the AUTO button for 5 seconds to enable/disable the KEY LOCK (w/o POWER) function.




The key lock message is displayed on the screen.



3.6 Selecting a Picture Mode

Note: Selecting the picture mode is not available when the input source is USB.

Press the PIC MODE button on the remote control repeatedly to toggle between different picture modes. The available options include "STANDARD", "VIDEO", and "CCTV".



The current picture mode is displayed on the screen. For example, standard as illustrated below.



Note: You can also change the picture mode in OSD menu. Refer to page 39.

3.7 Setting Sleep Time

Note: Setting the sleep time is not available when the input source is USB.

Press the SLEEP button on the remote control repeatedly to toggle between different sleep time intervals. The available options include "OFF", "10MINUTES", "20MINUTES", "30MINUTES", "60MINUTES", "90MINUTES", "120MINUTES", "180MINUTES", and "240MINUTES".




The current sleep time setting is displayed on the screen. For example, 10 minutes as illustrated below.



3.8 Viewing Source Information

Note: The source information function is not available when the input source is USB.

Press the INFO button on the remote control to view the source information.



3.9 Using the Multimedia Functions

In multimedia mode, you can view photos, listen to the music, watch films, and display text files from an external USB storage.

3.9.1 Navigating the Main Multimedia Menu

To switch the LCD display to the multimedia mode, do the following:

- 1. Turn on the LCD display. Refer to page 22.
- 2. Connect the USB storage with multimedia content to the USB port on the LCD display.
- 3. Set the input source to USB. Refer to page 24.

Note: The folders in multimedia menu can be opened only if you have connected a USB storage to the LCD display.

- Press the ▲/▼ button on the control panel or the remote control to select the folder with the media content that you want to play.
 - For viewing photos, select "PHOTO" folder.
 - For playing music, select "MUSIC" folder.
 - For watching films, select "MOVIE" folder.
 - For displaying a text file, select "TEXT" folder.

5. After making the selection, press the AUTO button on the control panel or the OK button on the remote control to open the folder.



- 6. Press the AUTO button on the control panel or the OK button on the remote control to browse the content of the folder.
 - Press the ▼ button on the control panel or the ◀ button on the remote control and then press the AUTO button on the control panel or the OK button on the remote control to return to the main multimedia menu.

3.9.2 Viewing Photos

1. Press the A/V button on the control panel or the remote control to select your favorite photo.

Note: After you select the photo, a preview of it with details will open on the left side of the browser. Details include information on resolution ("RES."), file size ("SIZE"), date ("DATE"), and time ("TIME") when the photo was captured.

- 2. Press the AUTO button on the control panel or the OK button on the remote control to open the photo.
 - Press the ▲/▼ button (repeatedly if necessary) on the control panel or the ▲/▼/◀/▶ button (repeatedly if necessary) on the remote control to select "RETURN". Then press the AUTO button on the control panel or the OK button on the remote control to return to the previous menu.



Note: If you receive an error message while trying to open a photo, probably the file format is not supported. Refer to page 50.

- By default, all available photos that are saved in the same folder on the USB storage are displayed in a playlist. To control the slideshow, press the ▲/▼ button on the control panel or the remote control to select the control button. Then press the AUTO button on the control panel or the OK button on the remote control to perform the function.
 - Note: If you cannot see the control bar, press the AUTO button on the control panel or the OK button on the remote control. To hide the control bar, press the MENU button on the control panel or the ▼ or the EXIT button on the remote control.



- D "PLAY" / D "PAUSE": The slideshow starts automatically after you choose a photo. Select "D" to pause the slideshow. Select "D" to resume the slideshow.
- 🚺 "PREV.": Display the previous photo.
- 🛛 "NEXT": Display the next photo.
- **U** "STOP": Stop the slideshow and return to the browser view.
- REPEAT. / REPEAT 1 / REPEAT ALL": Select "REPEAT..." to play the slideshow once and return to the browser view. Select "REPEAT 1" to repeat one and the same photo continuously. Select "REPEAT ALL" to repeat the slideshow continuously. After setting the repeat option, select "D".

Note: To adjust the volume during the slideshow, refer to page 23.

- E "PLAYLIST": List all image files in the slideshow. To open a specific file, select it. To exit the playlist, select "CANCEL".
- [1] "INFO": Display the current image file details. Select "CLOSE" to exit the information menu.

- 🕑 "ROTATE" (clockwise): Rotate the current photo clockwise.
- Image: "ROTATE" (counterclockwise): Rotate the current photo counterclockwise.
- 🖾 "ZOOM IN": Zoom in on the current photo 1/4x, 1/2x, 1x, 2x, 4x, or 8x. The zoom ratio is displayed on the screen.
- 🖾 "ZOOM OUT": Zoom out on the current photo 8x, 4x, 2x, 1x, 1/2x, or 1/4x. The zoom ratio is displayed on the screen.
- Image: Move...": After you have zoomed in on the photo, press the ▲/▼ button on the control panel or the ▲/▼/◄/▶ button on the remote control to move any location on the photo.

The navigation directions (green arrows) and the navigation map are displayed on the screen. The position of the zoomed area is indicated by yellow rectangle on the navigation map.

3.9.3 Listening to the Music

1. Press the ▲/▼ button on the control panel or the remote control to select your favorite music file.

Note: After you select a music file, a preview of it with details will open on the left side of the browser. Details include information on album name ("ALBUM"), title ("TITLE"), bit rate ("BIT RATE"), artist ("ARTIST"), and file size ("SIZE").

2. Press the AUTO button on the control panel or the OK button on the remote control to playback the music file.



Note: If you receive an error message while trying to open the music file, probably the file format is not supported. Refer to page 50.

By default, all available music files that are saved in the same folder on the USB storage are included in the playlist. To control the playback, press the ▲/▼ button on the control panel or the remote control to select the control button. Then press the AUTO button on the control panel or the OK button on the remote control to perform the function.

Note: If you cannot see the control bar, press the AUTO button on the control panel or the OK button on the remote control. To hide the control bar, press the MENU button on the control panel or the ▼ or the EXIT button on the remote control.

3.9.4 Watching Movie

 Press the ▲/▼ button on the control panel or the remote control to select your favorite movie file.


Note: After you select a film file, a preview of it with details will open on the left side of the browser. Details include information on resolution ("RES."), audio ("AUDIO…"), subtitle ("Subtitle"), program ("PROGRAM"), and file size ("SIZE").

2. Press the AUTO button on the control panel or the OK button on the remote control to open the video playback.



Note: If you receive an error message while trying to open the video file, probably the file format is not supported. Refer to page 50.

By default, all available video files that are saved in the same folder on the USB storage are included in the playlist. To control the playback, press the ▲/▼ button on the control panel or the remote control to select the control button. Then press the AUTO button on the control panel or the OK button on the remote control to perform the function.

6.5 Transporting the LCD Display

To transport the LCD display for repair or shipment, place the display in its original packaging box.


1. Remove the base stand (for SC-32E/SC-42E).

- a. Remove the screws securing the base stand to the base mount on the LCD display.
- b. Detach the base stand from the base mount.




2. Remove the base (for SC-32E/SC-42E).

- a. Remove the screws securing the base to the stand.
- b. Detach the base from the stand.

- 3. Place the LCD display inside the supplied protective bag.
- 4. Place the lower foam cushions inside the box.
- 5. Place the LCD display down in the box.
- 6. Place the upper foam cushions on the top of the LCD display.
- 7. Place the accessories on the designated area (if necessary).
- 8. Close and tape the box.

- It is recommended to use the original packaging box.
- When repacking, carefully place the LCD display in its box and protect the glass panel from touching any object.
